Note

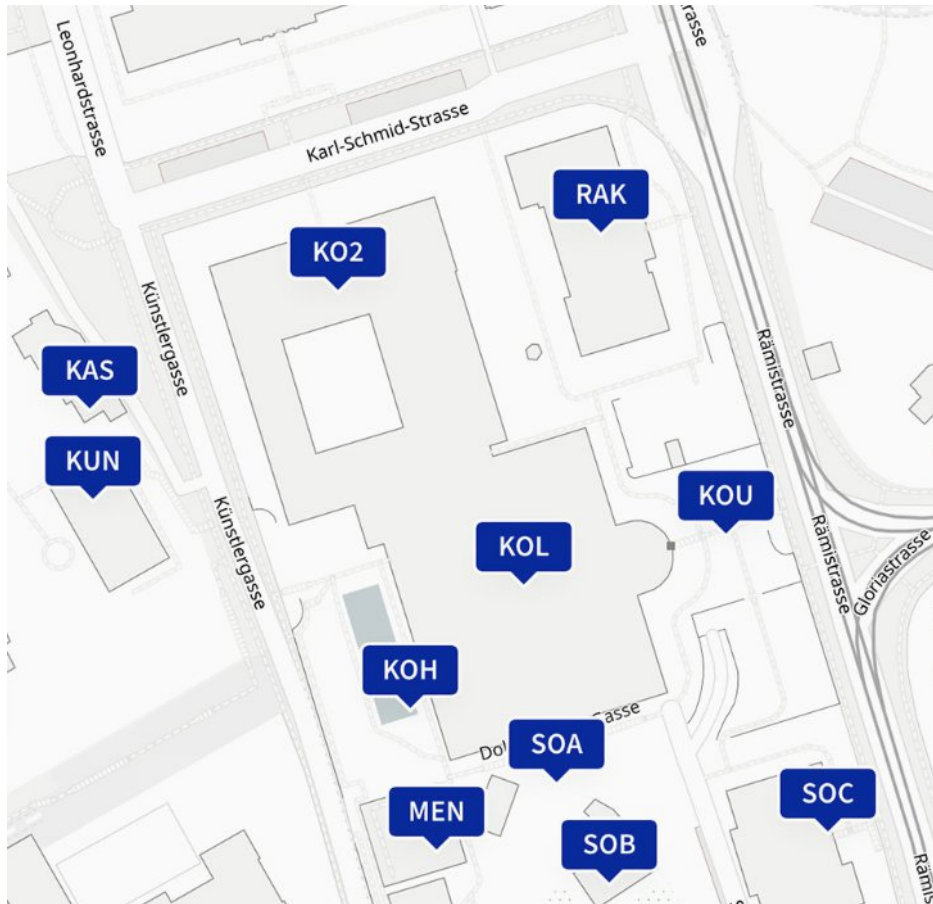
